Impact and outcomes of our Sports Premium spend 2022-23

The impact and outcomes of our spending have also continued to be measured against the 5 main strands below.:

- **Engagement of all pupils in regular physical exercise:**

This year we have once again ensured that every child in the school has had the opportunity to compete in different events outside of the school environment. The money spent on transport ensured that there was no barrier to any pupil being able to participate in regular physical exercise and ensured our school games makers were able to participate in their leadership day. The money spent on replenishing and adding to existing equipment for active playgrounds has ensured that engagement levels have remained high and that regular physical activity (in the form of 30 minutes a day) continues to be embedded. We continue to timetable for 2 hours (+) for physical education lessons and we have a comprehensive offer of extra curricular activities. The money spent on resourcing these ensures high levels of pupil engagement and that specific groups of pupils are targeted.

- **Profile of PE and Sport:**

The profile of PE and Sport at Parkroyal continues to remain high and a school priority. In early July we were awarded PLATINUM through the School Games Mark in recognition of the work we have done and what we have achieved. An accolade that acknowledges many consecutive years of the dedication towards and provision of PE and sport. We have continued to work closely with our SGO, our local secondary schools and other academy trust schools. We have continued to work with external providers and have enhanced our links within the local community further. We offer a broad

range of sports at Parkroyal and continue to compete in football, netball and cross country leagues; as well as School Games events, local events and trust events. The PE and Sports lead and coordinator work closely to ensure that provision of PE and sport is of the highest standard (as recognised above) and that opportunities to raise the profile are always planned for. The awarding of Sportsman and Sportswoman of the year, for the dedication to school sport, continues our legacy of recognising outstanding effort and achievement. It continues to inspire younger children to participate in sports and strive to achieve the award in the future. We have further invested in sporting kit and attire; supporting increasing the numbers of pupils who participate and raising the profile of the school sport. We believe that when we wear a uniform, we're representing something bigger than ourselves. There's a reason football fans spend millions per year on buying the latest shirt of the team they support - it gives them a sense of pride and belonging. Having school-branded sports kits and attire does the same. Just like regular school uniforms, matching sportswear can also help promote and foster togetherness, unity, and team spirit. A smart kit will be worn like a badge of honour, and makes everyone equal.

- **Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff teaching PE:**

The fourth year of using PE Passport has embedded our whole school approach to the delivery of PE. The app has continued to provide detailed plans, accompanying videos, skill grids and a rigorous assessment proforma to support teaching and learning. The experienced PE lead has worked closely with the PE coordinator to support their development in their new role; both as a subject coordinator and as a teacher. ECT's and newly appointed staff, have this year received support from the PE lead/coordinator in how to use the PE passport as a planning and teaching tool. We have also utilised coaches and external providers to develop our staff's knowledge of the teaching of PE.

Early intervention and developing pupils' fundamental skills are essential to the teaching and learning of PE. Our use of Rugbytots has continued to be impactful (as detailed below) but has also this year supported our early years staff in the delivery of high quality PE lessons; increasing confidence and skills.

- **Broader experience of range of sports offered:**

Much of the equipment and resources purchased were to enable the delivery of (mostly through extra curricular clubs this year) a wider range of sports. We entered a wide range of sporting competitions provided by our SGO and the school games partnership. The money spent on transport enabled pupils to visit a local independent school and use their outstanding facilities. This year, as part of our work on achieving platinum for the school games mark, we have focused on inclusion in sport. We have worked closely with Sale Sharks to run inclusion based workshops: with sports like wheelchair rugby. The PE lead and PE coordinator received CPD in the form of learning how to play Kinball- a new, inclusive and different sport for the pupils of Parkroyal. The PE lead and coordinator will then deliver their training on this to staff in school and Kinball will be another sport that pupils will

learn. The PE lead and coordinator, during allocated PE time, have worked closely on developing end points in PE and are ensuring that the curriculum offers a broader experience of sports.

- **Increased participation in competitive sport:**

As part of our MSSP (Macclesfield School Sports Partnership we attended a large number of competitions; different competitions that had very different intents: football (boys and girls), netball, hockey, lacrosse, tri golf, athletics, gymnastics, cricket to name but a few. We also participated in the season long football and netball leagues, fielding A and B teams and where possible C teams. Once again we increased the number of extra curricular opportunities for our pupils and utilised coaches, external providers and the local community/facilities. We have ensured that our curriculum PE (through the use of PE passport) incorporates participation in competitive sport. Having visitors in school (Sale Sharks, Dean Sibson) to promote and give real life examples of competitive sport has also contributed to increased participation.
